What is Sublimation?

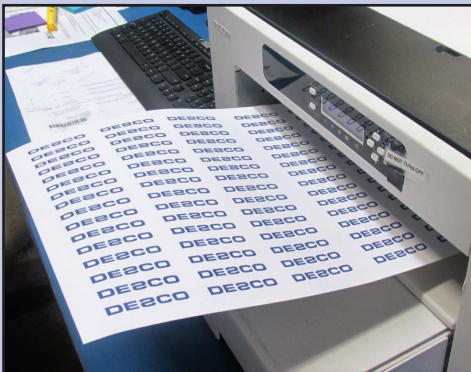
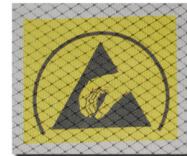
A method of transferring dye onto materials such as fabric. The graphics go from a solid state to a gas state without passing through a liquid stage and permeate the fibers of the fabric.

What is the Process?

Images are initially printed on coated heat-resistant transfer paper as a reverse image of the final design, which is then sublimated into the fabric in a heat press.

What are the Advantages?

- Long lasting color
- Images will not peel
- Dye does not build up on the fabric
- Maximum image size can be 10.5" x 16.5"



Typical Digitization Costs:

\$5.00 for first sublimation

\$3.00 for each additional sublimation
